5.1	Cllr.Shaw	That the Members would be updated in relation to the terms of the Local Improvement Scheme.
5.2	Cllr.Shaw	That this Council would update Members in relation to proposals to install e-working centres and wi-fi hot spots under the recent REDZ funding.
5.3	Cllr.Penrose	That Mullingar Municipal District would liaise with landowners at Molloy's Cross to see if the sightlines can be improved at exit from Road L1914 onto Road L1902, in the interests of the safety of road users.
5.4	Cllr.Penrose	That Mullingar Municipal District would include in its 2016 Estimates Road No.L59102 at Ballymacglavey, as this road is in urgent need of repair.
5.5	Cllr.Dollard	That Westmeath County Council would provide figures employed in and also work categories of participants in the Gateway Scheme.
5.6	Cllr.Dollard	That Westmeath County Council would provide details on how RAPID funding was expended during 2015.
5.7	Cllr.Clarke	That this Municipal District shows support with Montessori teachers in relation to the proposed changes to Regulation 3 and the urgent need for clarity on proposed changes.
5.8	Cllr.Clarke	That this Municipal District calls on the Minister for Health and on The Taoiseach to meet with the young women who were adversely affected by the Gardasil vaccine and with their parents.
5.9	Cllr.Duncan	That the Council would advise how much of the cowpark money has been invested back into the lake amenity areas, as previously advised.
5.10	Cllr.Duncan	That a portion of some of the remaining cowparks would be set aside for schools, to enable individual planting of trees by schoolchildren.
5.11	Cllr.Glynn	To call on Mullingar Municipal District to carry out a full review and audit on all traffic lights at the Green Bridge, given the daily mayhem which occurs at this location.
5.12	Cllr.Glynn	To call on Mullingar Municipal District to consider the provision of 1-2 dog fouling bins at either side of the Joe Dolan bridge, as part of a scheme to possibly roll out more of these bins on busy pedestrian routes, going forward.
5.13	Cllr.McDermott	That this Municipal District would repair potholes on cul de sac Road No. L55342 at Cumberstown.
5.14	Cllr.McDermott	That this Municipal District would raise the road in front of Bernie Tighe's house at Barradrum, Streete (L19274).
5.15	Cllr.Davitt	To call on Mullingar Municipal District to address the constant pooling of water on the road at Tuitestown, Collinstown.

5.20	Cllr.Burke	That Mullingar Municipal District would cost a re-vamp of the Town Park playgrounds, in order that Members can consider this under the 2016 Estimates.
5.21	Cllr.Daly	That double yellow lines to prevent parking would be applied on Main Street, Kilbeggan, both sides of the concealed entrance to the back yard of Kilbeggan Garda Barracks.
5.22	Cllr.Daly	That some immediate action would be taken to alleviate the flooding problem at Cyprian Corcoran's on the Ballyhast Road, Castletown-Geoghegan.
5.23	Cllr.Whitney	That Mullingar Municipal District ensures that applications are submitted to secure funding for safety works at both Glascorn Cross (R392/L1804/L5236) and at Molloy's Cross (L1902-11/L1914-6), as both areas have been identified as dangerous and in need of improved sightlines.
5.24	Cllr.Whitney	That Mullingar Municipal District would identify the fault and have the stretch of public lights from Rathowen Church to Rathowen Village switched back on.
