- (i) On the proposal of Cllr. Glynn, seconded by Cllr. McDermott, the Minutes of November Meeting of Mullingar Municipal District held at 2.00pm on Monday, 14th November, 2016 in the Council Chambers, Áras an Chontae, Mullingar were unanimously approved.

The Director updated Members on the new contract for Mullingar Recycling Centre and stated that this should be in place by the New Year and that it is a 3 year contract. He advised Members that a Press Release will issue when the new contract is in place.

Members were disappointed to note that the Recycling Centre will not be open for the Christmas period but the Director pointed out that there are alternative recycling facilities available in the town which should assist the public until the new contract is in place.

The Mayor then agreed to proceed with Item 3 and advised that Item 2 would be taken afterwards.

Item 3 : ***Replies to Questions***

The Replies to Questions for December were noted and supplementary questions answered, as listed hereunder.

Item 2 : To note funding for CLAR and REDZ programmes.

The Director advised the Members that funding in the amount of €96,000 has been made available under the REDZ Funding Programme in respect of Mullingar and Athlone Blueways and Greenways. He also advised that a further amount of €96,000 is being made available under the REDZ Funding Programme in respect of the Royal Canal to Lough Owel Amenity Area.

With regard to the CLAR Funding Programme, the Director advised that funding in the amount of €147,000 is being made available to Mullingar Municipal District for safety works at schools and community facilities throughout the District. Members noted the funding under the CLAR Programme.

Item 4 : Correspondence

While the identity of the polluter has not yet been established, Westmeath County Council and Inland Fisheries Ireland continue to monitor the situation and this remains an active investigation.
